WHAT

INTSABA is a God-inspired Village of Hope. It will provide safe housing for 250 orphans and vulnerable children, as well as health care, a quality education, opportunity to develop their skills and abilities and empowerment to reach their full potential.

It will be eco-friendly, using renewable energy, maintaining its pristine environment, featuring farm-to-table freshness in nutrition and unspoiled natural beauty for village occupants and visitors.

WHY

In the wake of the HIV/AIDS pandemic that took the lives of thousands of parents, eSwatini (formerly Swaziland) has a population of over 120,000 orphans and vulnerable children, with 10 to 15% of households headed by them.

Child-headed households are susceptible to abuse and exploitation. Malnutrition is a common problem. With girls heading most child-led households, one in three face sexual abuse. The traditional safety nets are not in place as older women face care of growing numbers of orphans they cannot support.

- Skills training, and more.


INTSABA will also include income generating projects to build sustainability including:

- A Crafts Center
- Social enterprises such as soap making, nut butter etc.
- A Retreat Center with accommodation for individuals, business and church events and families.

HOUSING

Before the farm was available, funds were collected to build small houses on tribal land to help protect children at risk. With the blessing of INTSABA, the houses will now be built in the children's village.

Donors who contributed \$10,000 toward a house will be able to experience the satisfaction of seeing the first structures developed and the first children served. Updates will be provided regularly.



HAPPENING NOW

The on-site SOHO missionary team is comprised of Dr. Tom Chittick, retired Agriculture Dean, plus Pamela and Amilcare Cominetti, mission and hospitality experts who have lived in southern Africa.

The macadamia nut plantation has been cleared of waist high weeds and the plants evaluated. With three farm workers, Tom and Amilcare have cleared the area around the farm house and are in the process of developing a large kitchen garden to include avocado trees, some mango and citrus as well as ample space for potatoes and edible greens.

Pamela has been researching the requirements for certification as an eco-friendly farm and establishing ground work so development can begin in earnest upon completion of the purchase of the farm.

It is now winter in eSwatini, and the ground is mostly dry. The only path to the macadamia plantation and some of the other arable areas is hazardous. As Dr Chittick explains, the road is narrow, just the width of the tractor, and it is built on the mountainside with a slope sometimes exceeding 45 degrees. An immediate goal is to have a new road built as soon as possible.


Help us to build a safe road
